DIVISION 15 or 16

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Please note:

- a) Divisions 15 or 16 include scholars who reach the age of 15 or 16 respectively on or before 31/12/02. (The year that Stage 1 lessons commenced).
- b) Scholars must record their division (ie.15 or 16 - not both), age and allocated examination number on each sheet.
- c) Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.
- d) Leave a space between each answer. 2-3 lines.
- e) The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.

SECTION 'A' - 8 QUESTIONS: (7 marks each) Suggested time 50 minutes

Paragraph answers only are required for this section.

1. Why has God caused the Bible to be written?
2. Why was Cain's sacrifice rejected and Abel's accepted by God?
3. How do conditions in the world today compare with the days of Noah? What must we do in order to escape God's coming judgments?
4. Describe God's call to Abram and how he responded.
5. List the main points of the promises to Abraham.
6. What ultimate purpose did Joseph see in his sufferings in Egypt?
7. What is the significance of the burning bush?
8. When Israel became prosperous they turned from Yahweh to idolatry. What lessons can we learn from this?

SECTION 'B' - 2 QUESTIONS: (22 marks each) Suggested time 40 minutes

2. How does the Covenant made in Eden foreshadow God's plan of redemption for mankind?
3. Explain the meaning of God's Memorial Name. What did it teach and how does it relate to us?
4. How is the crossing of the Red Sea a type of baptism into Christ?
