Please note:

- a) Division 11 or 12 include scholars who reach the age of 11 or 12 respectively on or before 31/12/04. (The year that Stage 3 lessons commenced).
- b) Scholars must record their division (ie. 11 or 12 - not both), age and allocated examination number on each sheet.
- c) Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.
- d) Leave a space between each answer 2-3 lines.
- e) The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.

SECTION 'A' - 25 QUESTIONS: (2 marks each) Suggested time 40 minutes

Short answers only are required for the following 25 questions.

1. When David became king in Jerusalem; what did he want to do for God?
2. What had David done as a boy that helped him to be a good king?
3. Which one of David's sons did God choose to be king after him?
4. When God appeared to Solomon in a dream, what did Solomon ask for?
5. Where was all the work done for building the Temple?
6. Who is the "chief corner stone" in the Temple God is building today?
7. Where did God first send Elijah to hide during the drought?
8. How did Elijah help the widow of Zarephath when her son died?
9. God showed His mighty power to Elijah on Mount Horeb in three terrifying ways. What were they?
10. How was Elijah taken away from Elisha?
11. What did Elisha say when he struck the waters of Jordan, with Elijah's mantle?
12. What did the Shunammite woman do for Elisha?
13. Whom did God choose to destroy the house of Ahab?
14. What did Jonah decide to do instead of obeying God?
15. What was the first thing Hezekiah did when he began to reign?

16. What happened to the army of the Assyrians camped against Jerusalem in Hezekiah's time?
17. When the Temple was being restored, during the reign of Josiah what did Hilkiah find?

19. The princes wanted to kill Jeremiah. Where did they throw him?
20. Why did Nebuchadnezzar want to slay all his wise men?
21. After returning from Babylon what was the first thing the people built in Jerusalem?
22. What wicked plan did Haman think up?
23. When Ahasuerus saw Esther standing in the inner court, what did he do?
24. Why did Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem?
25. What did Herod ask the wise men to do?

4. What sort of man was Nehemiah?

Select and answer two questions only from the following.

1. Give five examples of how Solomon is a type of Christ.
2. Tell what happened when Naaman visited Elisha's house, and how he was cured.
3. Tell the story of how Daniel was cast into the lions' den, and was saved.
4. Tell the story of the birth of John the Baptist and how he came to be named.
