DIVISION 15 or 16

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Please note:

- a) Divisions 15 or 16 include scholars who reach the age of 15 or 16 respectively on or before 31/12/04. (The year that Stage 3 lessons commenced).
- b) Scholars must record their division (ie.15 or 16 - not both), age and allocated examination number on each sheet.
- c) Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.
- d) Leave a space between each answer. 2-3 lines.
- e) The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.

➔ SECTION 'A' - 8 QUESTIONS: (7 marks each) Suggested time 50 minutes

Paragraph answers only are required for this section.

1. Why did Peter quote from Psalm 16 in his speech recorded in Acts 2?
2. What main lessons can we learn from Solomon's prayer at the opening of the Temple?
3. How was Jeroboam told that the kingdom would be divided and he would be king?
4. An unclean bird, a raven, fed Elijah at the brook Cherith. What lesson did Elijah learn from this?
5. What was Elijah to understand by "the still small voice"?
6. What reforms did Hezekiah institute in Judah and Jerusalem?
7. How was Jeremiah a type of Christ?
8. What was said by the angels to the shepherds when Jesus was born? What is the significance of these words?

➡ SECTION 'B' - 2 QUESTIONS: (22 marks each) Suggested time 40 minutes

Essay type answers requested for the section.

Select two questions only from the following.

1. How do David's Psalms reveal the life and mission of the Lord Jesus Christ? Give examples from two Psalms.
2. Compare the glory of Solomon's reign with that of the future reign of Christ.
3. Show how the image of Daniel 2 is an outline of world history.
4. In what way did the birth of Jesus confirm the Old Testament.
