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Please note:

- a) *Divisions 13 or 14 include scholars who reach the age of 13 or 14 respectively on or before 31/12/11. The year that Stage 5 lessons commenced.*
- b) *Scholars must record their division (ie. 13 or 14 - not both), age and allocated examination number on each sheet.*
- c) *Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.*
- d) *Leave a space between each answer. 2-3 lines.*
- e) *The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.*

➤ SECTION 'A' - 8 Questions: (7 marks each) Suggested time 50 minutes

One paragraph only is required to answer each question in this section.

1. What did Peter and John give the lame man at the Beautiful Gate?
2. In Stephen's speech what main point was he trying to show the unbelieving Jews? Give an example to show how he did this?
3. Using examples from the lesson on Philip's preaching to the Ethiopian Eunuch, show the conditions God requires for true baptism.
4. Why was Paul stoned at Lystra?
5. What decisions were made at the Jerusalem Conference and why?
6. How did the Gospel triumph over superstition in Ephesus?
7. How did Paul answer the charges made against him when brought before Felix the governor?
8. Describe the link between watching world events and keeping ourselves unspotted from the world.

2. Describe Saul's conversion to Christ.
3. Describe the conversion of Lydia and the jailor at Philippi.
4. In a brief outline describe Paul's storm tossed journey from Caesarea to Malta, as he travelled to Rome to appear before Caesar.
