Please note:

- a) Divisions 15 or 16 include scholars who reach the age of 15 or 16 respectively on or before 31/12/11. The year that Stage 5 lessons commenced.
- b) Scholars must record their division (ie. 15 or 16 - not both), age and allocated examination number on each sheet.
- c) Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.
- d) Leave a space between each answer. 2-3 lines.
- e) The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.

➔ SECTION 'A' - 8 Questions: (7 marks each) Suggested time 50 minutes

Paragraph answers only are required for this section.

1. The apostles asked the Lord, "Wilt thou at this time restore again the Kingdom to Israel?" What was deficient in their understanding?
2. What things does the incident of the Ethiopian eunuch teach us are necessary for salvation?
3. When was the collection for the poor saints at Jerusalem initiated and why did Paul support it so strongly?
4. What was the purpose of the Law of Moses?
5. Describe the kind of people who made up Paul's audience on Mars Hill.
6. What did Paul say to King Agrippa about the hope of the promises and the resurrection of the dead?
7. What is the purpose of baptism in God's plan of redemption?
8. Why is the Word of God described as the "sword of the Spirit?"

Select two questions only from the following.

3. Describe Paul's journey to Rome, mentioning where he boarded the first ship, where he changed vessels and where he was shipwrecked.
4. Give seven reasons that show that the coming of Christ is near at hand.
