PRIMARY INSTRUCTIONS STAGE 3 (4–6 years)

PARENTS PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Your children look for and need your support, encouragement, and ideas when working on their projects, but the actual work on each page must be the child's own work.
- Remember that the layout and size of the pictures on each page must not be altered, to ensure fairness in marking.
- The activities have been printed on one side of the page for ease of completion. The activity must be completed on this side only. Any extra information placed on the back of the page won't be considered for marking.
- Do not write your name anywhere on the project.
- Hand the project in to your Sunday School Superintendent by the due date, **27th JULY 2025**.

PLEASE NOTE:

- "Show" means you may choose to draw, paint, glue, use collage or any other technique to illustrate the subject. Some ideas: pipe cleaners, sandpaper, foil, fabric, etc.
- "Colour" means you may use pencil, paint, crayon, texta or glued on colour or decorations to make your picture attractive.
- "Write" means you may write with pencil, biro, texta etc, or you may use any other way to tell your answer in words.

- Page 1. Title Page**
Colour in the page as neatly as you can
- Page 2. Solomon – Lesson 3**
Here is the Queen of Sheba visiting King Solomon to hear his wisdom.
1. Colour them both and make their clothes bright because they were very rich.....
2. The Queen of Sheba brought a great camel train with her, laden with presents for Solomon. Behind the Queen of Sheba, show a camel or two carrying spices, gold and precious stones. You can use the one/s on the cut-out page or draw/show your own.....
- Page 3. Elijah – Lesson 6**
Elijah used 12 stones to build an altar on Mt Carmel to show who was the true God.
1. Complete the picture of Elijah's sacrifice. Suggestion: Use cellophane for flames, sandpaper for stones, toothpicks for wood and glitter for water. You may have other ideas you can use!
2. Show Elijah at the side of the altar
- Page 4. Naaman – Lesson 11**
1. Join the dots to complete the picture of Naaman - curve your lines slightly outwards. Suggestion: You may like to complete the tree by using small leaves from a bush and glue them on (don't worry if they change colour), or you can cut out the leaves from coloured paper, or anything else you can think of
2. In the space at the side of the page write the number that tells us how many times Elisha told Naaman to dip in the water and then he would be cured of leprosy

Page 5. Jonah – Lesson 12

A big fish swallowed Jonah after he was thrown out of the boat and into the sea.

1. Trace over the letters of the title to spell out 'Jonah'
2. Colour in the big fish
3. Colour in the rest of the page blue to show it is under water. You may like to use blue glitter or show some smaller fishes swimming too!
4. Colour in Jonah on the cut-out page, cut him out and glue him on the page falling in the water

Page 6. Fiery Furnace – Lesson 17

Daniel's friends refused to bow down and worship Nebuchadnezzar's image because they believed in the one true God. Because of this they were thrown into the fiery furnace.

1. Make the furnace look very hot. You can use coloured cellophane for flames and cotton wool or pieces of white tissue for smoke
2. Show the right number of men that the king saw inside the furnace

Page 7. Queen Esther – Lesson 19

The king loved Esther the most and chose to make her queen, which was part of God's plan to save His people, the Jews.

1. Draw a crown on Esther's head to show that she was made queen. You may like to decorate the crown with glitter etc
2. Colour in Queen Esther and make her look pretty

Page 8. Baby Jesus – Lesson 23

Jesus, the Son of God, was born in Bethlehem, in a manger!

1. Colour the picture of the stables
2. Colour the pictures of baby Jesus and Mary on the cut-out page, then cut them out and glue them on the page
3. Add some of the animals from the cut-out page or draw your own to complete the scene

Cover

When you have completed the inside of your project, cover the project and decorate it. You could write some words which give a title to the project. It may be "The Glory and Decline of the Kingdom" or a suitable quote. You might even add a picture about the lessons on the front. To protect your project you could cover it with plastic or contact. Do not write your name anywhere on the project

When you have finished your project, check to make sure you have completed all the instructions (use the check boxes) and then remove the cut out pages and instructions from your project.
